Government is committed to prioritising regional and national projects of significance; facilitate or procuring funding for regional and national projects of significance; make it easier to consent new infrastructure including renewable energy; simplifying the planning system and related statutes including the Public Works Act and the Reserves Act. Make submissions here by 19 April.
- 3. Kay Harrison (ANZ Climate Change Ambassador), and Lindsey Fielder-Cook (Quaker United Nations Office) will be at a Yearly Meeting Session on 26 April.
- Quaker climate weekend 19-21 July (An opportunity for everyone to bring their issues/opportunities/interests and join with others with mutual interests. **Climate left right out -** Government's recent <u>Budget Policy Statement</u> mentions 'environment' once and 'climate' not at all (p.5-6). The statement is important, because that is how the money get spent.

Even the <u>International Monetary Fund</u> (IMF) states that Aotearoa NZ's structural reforms need to "boost the housing supply, revive productivity growth, lower emissions, and *address challenges from climate change*" [emphasis mine].

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**Maybe this is why climate is left out -** In the latest opinion survey, 19% of us rate climate change as one of our top three issues. We are much more concerned about inflation/ cost of living (59%); housing (33%), healthcare (33%), crime / law and order (27%), and the economy (25%). People most likely to rate climate change among their top three issues in Aotearoa NZ tend to be aged 65+ (27%). People least likely are those aged 18-34 (15%) or Māori (15%) (See <u>IPSOS NZ Issues Monitor</u> February 2024). Māori are more concerned about issues facing Māori (29%), and poverty and inequality (28%); young people are more concerned about crime / law and order (20%). More immediate priorities?

<u>Federated Farmers</u> are concerned our climate targets might be unrealistic; the article was in the last newsletter. We got two responses.

**Quaker 1** responded: my thoughts are that they [Federated Farmers] are criminal. ... decades of Federated Farmers resisting any progressive policies on reducing climate emission, support[ing] continuing lack of action and giv[ing] no thought to the world which our children will inhabit. Their arguments confuse our increase in emissions, with other countries not meeting targets, ignoring the fact that many countries have made substantial reductions, and we are standouts in our per person emissions. The challenge is how to advance such a position in a 'Quakerly' way.

**Quaker 2** sent a blog featuring the following comment from former Federated Farmers President Owen Jennings - *NZ* has 1% of the Ruminants - ruminants as a whole only make up 14% of emissions – Why are they trying to tax and coerce our farmers out of farming beef/dairy cows??? Why are they brain washing the masses into believing farming is bad for the climate?
