_____Gerard Manley Hopkins *As kingfishers catch fire* His poems were first published posthumously in 1918, in a volume edited by his friend Robert Bridges_

Gerard Manley Hopkins came from a talented and well-read family and was firstly a skilled artist. Poetry came later, after studying at Oxford, but in 1868 he felt that poetry was getting in the way of his intention to 'be religious' and he destroyed his collection in a bonfire. Soon after, he began his studies to be a Jesuit priest and it was seven years before he returned to poetry. His desire to describe the natural world was expressed in poetry, sketching and he even wrote music, all the while trying to reconcile this self-expression with a tendency towards religious aceticism. The joy and wonder in his response to nature is often linked to praising God. His poetic style was innovative and influenced modern poetry.
